Manitoba's One Great Summer Path Begins Early on June 26, 2021



As of June 23rd, 2021, Manitobans achieved and surpassed the first key vaccination benchmarks set out under the '4-3-2 One Great Summer' Reopening Path, with over 71 per cent of eligible Manitobans at least partially immunized and more than 27 per cent having received both doses. Together with declining COVID-19 cases, test positivity and hospitalization rates, Manitobans are now able to begin to enjoy more freedoms and fewer public health restrictions.

As such, Manitoba will move ahead with the first milestone of its '4-3-2 One Great Summer' Reopening Path one week early and open many businesses and facilities to 25 per cent capacity beginning on June 26th, 2021.

Manitobans who are fully immunized (two vaccine doses plus two weeks from the time of their second dose) will now benefit from the following exemptions:

- visit loved ones in personal care homes or hospitals;
- travel domestically for essential and non-essential purposes outside of Manitoba without the requirement to self-isolate on their return; and,
- dine indoors at restaurants and bars with other fully immunized friends and family from outside your household.

Under this first milestone of the '4-3-2 One Great Summer' Reopening Path, Manitobans will also be able to gather in larger numbers, dine out in restaurants and on patios, attend faith-based services, and go to gyms, hair salons and retail stores in every region of the province, with some restrictions.

Effective 12:01 a.m. Saturday, June 26, all Manitobans will benefit from the following highlighted changes — but will remain subject to public health order restrictions specific to their sector as identified under the orders:

| SECTOR | REVISED RESTRICTIONS |
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| NON - LICENSED & LICENSED RESTAURANTS | NEW! Restaurants and bars to reopen at 25 per cent capacity for indoors and 50 per cent for outdoor dining. For indoor dining, patrons seated together must be from the same household unless all patrons at the table are fully immunized. Patrons who are fully immunized and from different households may dine together. For outdoor dining, tables are limited to a maximum of 8 patrons and can be from different households regardless of immunization status. Members of the public must be assigned tables upon entering and must not move tables or chairs inside or outside of the premises. In addition to the above relaxed restrictions the following restrictions from previous health orders may still apply: • physical distancing measures in place between tables; • contact tracing information gathered from all parties; • patrons must wear a mask at all times when entering or existing the premises or moving to and from their seat • patrons must remain at their tables except for specific purposes such as using washroom facilities or brief interactions with staff etc; • the use of hookahs or other types of water pipes in the premises are prohibited • food cannot be served buffet style; and • food cannot be served for dine-in between the hours of 10 p.m. and 6 a.m. Takeout and delivery is permitted. • liquor can only be served if a meal has been ordered; and • liquor cannot be sold or served between the hours of 10 p.m. and 9 a.m.; • sound levels in the licensed premises do not exceed 80 decibels • no dancing takes place in the licensed premises must take responsible measures to ensure compliance with the requirements detailed above. Persons who claim to reside at the same private residence may be required to present identification that shows their address or sign a declaration confirming that they all reside in the same residence. |

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| SECTOR | REVISED RESTRICTIONS |
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| RETAIL, MALLS, GARDEN CENTRES & MARKETS | NEW! Retail businesses to open with increased capacity at 25 per cent to a limit of 250 persons. In addition to the above relaxed restrictions the following restrictions from previous health orders may still apply: • physical distancing measures between patrons; • patrons and staff must wear a mask in the facility at all times; NOTE: Food Courts in a shopping centre or mall may be open if the operator or the shopping mall: • ensures that the number of members of the public in the food court does not exceed 25% of the usual seating capacity of the food court; and; • physical distancing measures between patrons; • patrons and staff must wear a mask; • Persons may sit together at a table in the food court only if: • they are fully immunized; • they all reside in the same private residence, regardless of their immunization status; or • there is a combination of persons over and under12 years of age at the table, but all persons over the age of 12 are fully immunized. • The operator of the shopping centre or mall must take responsible measures to ensure compliance with the requirements of subsection 5 (seating within the food court.) Persons who claim to be fully immunized must provide proof that they are fully immunized. Persons who claim to reside at the same private residence may be required to present identification that shows their address or sign a declaration confirming that they all reside in the same residence. |
| GYMS, FITNESS CENTRES & YOGA STUDIOS | NEW! Gyms and fitness facilities can reopen at 25 per cent capacity for individual and group classes with the following measures in place: In addition to the above relaxed restrictions the following restrictions from previous health orders may still apply: • physical distancing measures between patrons; • patrons and staff must wear a mask in the facility at all times; • contact tracing information must be gathered from all patrons. • access to change rooms must be limited to 50% of the usual capacity or to a number that ensures that all persons in the change room are able to maintain a separation of 2 meters from other persons, which ever is lesser |
| PERSONAL SERVICES BUSINESSES | NEW! Reopen at 25 per cent capacity on an appointment only basis, with physical distancing measure in place between patrons and workstations, with contact tracing information collected from patron. Mask requirements still apply. Personal services businesses include those providing hairdressing, barbering, manicures, pedicures, electrolysis, cosmetic application, tanning, tattooing or massage services that are not administered by a health professional. |
| WEDDINGS & FUNERALS Manitoba Business Matters | NEW! Open to 25 participants for outdoors ceremonies in addition to photographer and officiants. Indoor weddings and funerals remain limited to 10 persons NOTE: The operator of the premises where the wedding or the funeral takes place implements measures to ensure that all persons attending are reasonably able to maintain a separation of at least 2 meters from others. Participants and facility staff must wear a mask. Please also note that there is currently no information available as to the possible restrictions pertaining to live music or singing. |

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| SECTOR | REVISED RESTRICTIONS |
| GOLF COURSES | NEW! The operator of a golf course that is the subject of a liquor service licence may serve liquor to persons while they are playing golf. These persons are not required to purchase food with their liquor or to be seated while in possession of their liquor when they are golfing. |
| INDOOR SPORTS & RECREATION | NEW! Indoor sports and recreation facilities can open at 25 per cent capacity to a limit of 5 persons per class or training activity; no tournaments are permitted. In addition to the above relaxed restrictions the following restrictions from previous health orders may still apply: reasonable measures must be taken to ensure that there is no interaction between different groups of participants within the facility at the same time measures are in place to ensure compliance with the applicable capacity limits and physical distancing requirements as set out in the orders contact tracing information must be gathered from all patrons. access to change rooms must be limited to 50% of the usual capacity or to a number that ensures that all persons in the change room are able to maintain a separation of 2 meters from other persons, which ever is lesser |
| OUTDOOR SPORTS & RECREATION | NEW! Outdoor sports and recreation facilities can open at a maximum capacity of 25 persons; no tournaments are permitted. In addition to the above relaxed restrictions the following restrictions from previous health orders may still apply: physical distancing measures between patrons where possible; access to change rooms must be limited to 50% of the usual capacity or to a number that ensures that all persons in the change room are able to maintain a separation of 2 meters from other persons, which ever is lesser |
| DANCE, THEATRE & MUSIC SCHOOLS | NEW! Dance, Theatre and Music can reopen at 25 per cent capacity to a limit of 5 students per class, or 25 persons outdoors. In addition to the above relaxed restrictions the following restrictions from previous health orders may still apply: • physical distancing measures between participants where reasonably possible; • measures are in place to ensure compliance with the applicable capacity limits set out in the orders • contact tracing information must be gathered from all patrons. |
| DAY CAMPS | NEW! Day Camps may reopen to a maximum of 20 participants in groups. In addition to the above relaxed restrictions the following restrictions from previous health orders may still apply: • no joint activities between groups may take place • participants must bring their own food and beverages or all food and beverages served at the camp are individually packaged • All overnight camping activities at camps for children are prohibited. |
| INDOOR & OUTDOOR SWIMMING POOLS Manitoba Business Matters | NEW! Indoor and outdoor swimming pools may reopen to a maximum capacity of 25 per cent of the usual capacity of the pool. Swimmers are not required to wear a mask while in the pool. Lifeguards are not required to wear a mask while on duty. In addition to the above relaxed restrictions the following restrictions from previous health orders may still apply: implement measures to ensure that the members of the public in the pool are reasonably able to maintain physical distancing requirements access to change rooms must be limited to 50% of the usual capacity or to a number that ensures that all persons in the change room are able to maintain a separation of 2 meters from other persons, which ever is lesser |

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| PHOTOGRAPHERS & VIDEOGRAPHERS | NEW! A business that provides photography or videography services may open In addition to the above relaxed restrictions the following restrictions from previous health orders may still apply: |
| | measures are in place to ensure compliance with the applicable capacity limits set out in the orders with respect to indoor and outdoor weddings and funerals |
| | provide services at the business premises to individual persons who reside at the same private residence or with patrons who are fully immunized and from different households |
| | provide services outdoors in groups and/or outdoor gatherings with the applicable capacity limits as set out in the orders |
| | contact tracing information must be gathered from all patrons. |
| INDOOR SELF-HELP GATHERINGS | NEW! Indoor Self-Help gatherings my open at a maximum capacity of 25 persons In addition to the above relaxed restrictions the following restrictions from previous health orders may still apply: • physical distancing measures between patrons; • Masks must be worn at all times |
| | contact tracing information must be gathered from all patrons. |
| WORKPLACES | CONTINUED: Workplaces are required to allow employees to work from home wherever possible. |
| MOVIE THEATRES & CONCERT HALLS | CONTINUED: Movie Theatres and Concert Halls must remain closed. |
| MUSEUMS, GALLERIES & LIBRARIES | CONTINUED: Museums, Galleries and Libraries must remain closed. |
| CASINOS & VLTS | CONTINUED: Casinos and VLTs must remain closed. |

ADDITIONAL UPDATES:

PRIVATE RESIDENCES - Up to 10 visitors are permitted outdoors on private property, in addition to those who reside there. Visitors may briefly enter the home for essential reasons.

INDOOR GATHERINGS IN PRIVATE RESIDENCES - Not permitted.

OUTDOOR GATHERINGS IN PUBLIC SPACES - Up to 25 people permitted in outdoor public spaces, social distancing and masking as outlined in the public health orders still required.

INDOOR COMMUNITY, CULTURAL & RELIGIOUS GATHERINGS - Permitted to open to a 25 per cent capacity to a maximum of 25 persons, masks must be worn at all times and proper physical distancing must be maintained.

OUTDOOR COMMUNITY, **CULTURAL & RELIGIOUS GATHERINGS** - Permitted to open to maximum capacity of 25 persons, masks must be worn at all times and proper physical distancing must be maintained. Drive-in services continue to be permitted.
