

NEW PUBLIC HEALTH ORDERS

SECOND MILESTONE REACHED EARLY;

BUSINESSES REOPENING AT 50 PER CENT on July 17, 2021




The province will implement the second phase of the '4-3-2-One Great Summer' Reopening Path two weeks early, on July 17, 2021, as vaccination rates continue to climb across the province.

Under the second phase of the '4-3-2 One Great Summer' Reopening Path, most facilities may now open to 50 per cent capacity, allowing more people to gather indoors and outdoors, shop, dine out, visit cultural and recreational facilities, and more. Fully immunized Manitobans who have received two vaccination doses at least two weeks ago, may enjoy even more benefits under new public health orders.

In all cases, following the COVID-19 fundamentals, including indoor mask use and physical distancing, is still required to protect the health and well-being of all Manitobans.

The orders are scheduled to expire at 12:01 a.m. Saturday, Aug. 7, 2021, and will be reassessed at that time in the context of vaccination rates and the province's overall COVID-19 situation.

Effective 12:01 a.m. Saturday, July 17, 2021, all Manitobans will benefit from the following highlighted changes — but will remain subject to public health order restrictions specific to their sector as identified under the orders:

SECTOR	REVISED RESTRICTIONS
<p>NON - LICENSED & LICENSED RESTAURANTS</p> 	<p>NEW! Restaurants and bars to reopen at 50 per cent capacity for indoors and 50 per cent for outdoor dining. For indoor dining, patrons seated together must be from the same household unless all patrons at the table are fully immunized. Patrons who are fully immunized and from different households may dine together. For outdoor dining, tables are limited to a maximum of 8 patrons and can be from different households regardless of immunization status. Members of the public must be assigned tables upon entering and must not move tables or chairs inside or outside of the premises.</p> <p>In addition to the above relaxed restrictions the following restrictions from previous health orders may still apply:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• NEW: Opening hours are expanded to midnight• NEW: The requirement to purchase food when consuming alcohol no longer applies• NEW: VLTs in licensed establishments may be operated with two metres of physical distancing and all other restaurant/bar rules applying; VLTs in unlicensed establishments will follow the <u>casino rules</u> allowing only only vaccinated people• physical distancing measures in place between tables;• contact tracing information gathered from all parties;• patrons must wear a mask at all times when entering or existing the premises or moving to and from their seat• patrons must remain at their tables except for specific purposes such as using washroom facilities or brief interactions with staff etc;• the use of hookahs or other types of water pipes in the premises are prohibited• food cannot be served buffet style; and• sound levels in the licensed premises do not exceed 80 decibels• no dancing takes place in the licensed premises• The operator of the licensed premises must take responsible measures to ensure compliance with the requirements detailed above. Persons who claim to be fully immunized must provide proof that they are fully immunized. Persons who claim to reside at the same private residence may be required to present identification that shows their address or sign a declaration confirming that they all reside in the same residence.

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<p>RETAIL, MALLS, GARDEN CENTRES & MARKETS</p>	<p>NEW! Retail businesses to open with increased capacity at 50 per cent to a limit of 500 persons. Mall capacity limited to the aggregate capacity of its stores.</p> <p>In addition to the above relaxed restrictions the following restrictions from previous health orders may still apply:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> physical distancing measures between patrons; patrons and staff must wear a mask in the facility at all times; <p>NOTE: Food Courts in a shopping centre or mall may be open if the operator or the shopping mall:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ensures that the number of members of the public in the food court does not exceed 50% of the usual seating capacity of the food court; and; physical distancing measures between patrons; patrons and staff must wear a mask; Persons may sit together at a table in the food court only if: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> they are fully immunized; they all reside in the same private residence, regardless of their immunization status; or there is a combination of persons over and under 12 years of age at the table, but all persons over the age of 12 are fully immunized. The operator of the shopping centre or mall must take responsible measures to ensure compliance with the requirements of subsection 5 (seating within the food court.) Persons who claim to be fully immunized must provide proof that they are fully immunized. Persons who claim to reside at the same private residence may be required to present identification that shows their address or sign a declaration confirming that they all reside in the same residence.
<p>GYMS, FITNESS CENTRES & YOGA STUDIOS</p>	<p>NEW! Gyms and fitness facilities can reopen at 50 per cent capacity for individual and group classes with the following measures in place:</p> <p>In addition to the above relaxed restrictions the following restrictions from previous health orders may still apply:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> physical distancing measures of a minimum of 3 metres between patrons; patrons and staff must wear a mask in the facility at all times; contact tracing information must be gathered from all patrons. access to change rooms must be limited to 50% of the usual capacity or to a number that ensures that all persons in the change room are able to maintain a separation of 2 meters from other persons, whichever is lesser
<p>CASINOS, BINGO HALLS & VLTs</p>	<p>NEW! Casinos, bingo halls and VLT lounges can reopen at 50 per cent capacity to fully immunized people only:</p> <p>In addition to the above relaxed restrictions the following restrictions from previous health orders may still apply:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> physical distancing measures of a minimum of 2 metres between patrons; and all other restaurant/bar rules apply in licensed and unlicensed situations;
<p>PERSONAL SERVICES BUSINESSES</p> 	<p>NEW! Reopen at 50 per cent capacity. Appointments are no longer required. Physical distancing measure in place between patrons and workstations, with contact tracing information collected from patron. Mask requirements still apply.</p> <p>Personal services businesses include those providing hairdressing, barbering, manicures, pedicures, electrolysis, cosmetic application, tanning, tattooing or massage services that are not administered by a health professional.</p>

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WEDDINGS & FUNERALS	<p>NEW! Open to 150 participants for outdoors ceremonies in addition to photographer and officiants. Indoor weddings and funerals remain limited to 25 persons in addition to photographer and officiants.</p> <p>NOTE: The operator of the premises where the wedding or the funeral takes place implements measures to ensure that all persons attending are reasonably able to maintain a separation of at least 2 meters from others. Participants and facility staff must wear a mask.</p> <p>Please also note that there is currently no information available as to the possible restrictions pertaining to live music or singing.</p>
INDOOR SPORTS & RECREATION	<p>NEW! Indoor sports and recreation facilities can open with 25 people per group; no tournaments are permitted.</p> <p>In addition to the above relaxed restrictions the following restrictions from previous health orders may still apply:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">reasonable measures must be taken to ensure that there is no interaction between different groups of participants within the facility at the same timemeasures are in place to ensure compliance with the applicable capacity limits and physical distancing requirements as set out in the orderscontact tracing information must be gathered from all patrons.access to change rooms must be limited to 50% of the usual capacity or to a number that ensures that all persons in the change room are able to maintain a separation of 2 meters from other persons, which ever is lesser
OUTDOOR SPORTS & RECREATION	<p>NEW! Outdoor sports and recreation facilities can open at a maximum capacity of 50 persons; no tournaments are permitted. Spectators are permitted without counting towards the capacity limit.</p> <p>In addition to the above relaxed restrictions the following restrictions from previous health orders may still apply:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">physical distancing measures between patrons where possible;access to change rooms must be limited to 50% of the usual capacity or to a number that ensures that all persons in the change room are able to maintain a separation of 2 meters from other persons, which ever is lesser
DANCE, THEATRE & MUSIC SCHOOLS	<p>NEW! Dance, Theatre and Music can reopen at 50 per cent capacity to a limit of 25 people indoors.</p> <p>In addition to the above relaxed restrictions the following restrictions from previous health orders may still apply:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">physical distancing measures between participants where reasonably possible;measures are in place to ensure compliance with the applicable capacity limits set out in the orderscontact tracing information must be gathered from all patrons.
DAY CAMPS	<p>NEW! Day Camps may reopen to a maximum of 25 participants in groups.</p> <p>In addition to the above relaxed restrictions the following restrictions from previous health orders may still apply:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">no joint activities between groups may take placeparticipants must bring their own food and beverages or all food and beverages served at the camp are individually packagedAll overnight camping activities at camps for children are prohibited.



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MOVIE THEATRES & CONCERT HALLS	<p>NEW! Movie theatres and concert halls may reopen to a maximum capacity of 50 per cent of the usual capacity to fully immunized people only. Unvaccinated children under the age of 12 may attend if accompanied by fully vaccinated members of their household.</p> <p>In addition to the above relaxed restrictions the following restrictions from previous health orders may still apply:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• physical distancing measures between patrons;• patrons and staff must wear a mask in the facility at all times
MUSEUMS & GALLERIES	<p>NEW! Museums and galleries can reopen at 50 per cent capacity for fully immunized people only. Unvaccinated children under 12 may attend if accompanied by fully vaccinated members of their household. Museums operate under the fully vaccinated requirement when open to the public as a museum, both indoors and out. If the museum is used as a venue for a private event for another purpose (e.g. wedding), then the appropriate orders apply.</p> <p>In addition to the above relaxed restrictions the following restrictions from previous health orders may still apply:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• physical distancing measures between patrons;• patrons and staff must wear a mask in the facility at all times
LIBRARIES	<p>NEW! Libraries can reopen at 50 per cent capacity to a maximum of 150 people.</p> <p>In addition to the above relaxed restrictions the following restrictions from previous health orders may still apply:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• physical distancing measures between patrons;• patrons and staff must wear a mask in the facility at all times
INDOOR & OUTDOOR SWIMMING POOLS	<p>NEW! Indoor and outdoor swimming pools may reopen to a maximum capacity of 50 per cent of the usual capacity of the pool. Swimmers are not required to wear a mask while in the pool. Lifeguards are not required to wear a mask while on duty.</p> <p>In addition to the above relaxed restrictions the following restrictions from previous health orders may still apply:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• implement measures to ensure that the members of the public in the pool are reasonably able to maintain physical distancing requirements• access to change rooms must be limited to 50% of the usual capacity or to a number that ensures that all persons in the change room are able to maintain a separation of 2 meters from other persons, which ever is lesser
PHOTOGRAPHERS & VIDEOGRAPHERS	<p>NEW! A business that provides photography or videography services may open</p> <p>In addition to the above relaxed restrictions the following restrictions from previous health orders may still apply:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• measures are in place to ensure compliance with the applicable capacity limits set out in the orders with respect to indoor and outdoor weddings and funerals• provide services at the business premises to individual persons who reside at the same private residence or with patrons who are fully immunized and from different households• provide services outdoors in groups and/or outdoor gatherings with the applicable capacity limits as set out in the orders• contact tracing information must be gathered from all patrons.



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PROFESSIONAL SPORTS & PERFORMING ARTS	NEW! Professional sports or performing arts events may open up to 100% for fully vaccinated people with a plan approved by public health.
HORSE & AUTO RACING	Approved at the discretion of the Chief Medical Officer of Health.
INDOOR SELF-HELP GATHERINGS	NEW! Indoor Self-Help gatherings fall under public gathering in indoor space limits—open at a maximum capacity of 25 persons In addition to the above relaxed restrictions the following restrictions from previous health orders may still apply: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• physical distancing measures between patrons;• Masks must be worn at all times• contact tracing information must be gathered from all patrons.
WORKPLACES	NEW! Libraries can reopen at 50 per cent capacity to a maximum of 150 people.

ADDITIONAL UPDATES:

OUTDOOR GATHERINGS AT PRIVATE RESIDENCES - Up to 25 visitors are permitted outdoors on private property, in addition to those who reside there.

INDOOR GATHERINGS IN PRIVATE RESIDENCES NEW: Up to 5 visitors permitted in addition to those who reside in the home.

INDOOR GATHERINGS IN PUBLIC SPACES Up to 25 people permitted in indoor public spaces, social distancing and masking as outlined in the public health orders still required.

OUTDOOR GATHERINGS IN PUBLIC SPACES - Up to 150 people permitted in outdoor public spaces, social distancing and masking as outlined in the public health orders still required.

INDOOR COMMUNITY, CULTURAL & RELIGIOUS GATHERINGS - Permitted to open to 50 per cent capacity to a maximum of 150 persons, masks must be worn at all times and proper physical distancing must be maintained.

OUTDOOR COMMUNITY, CULTURAL & RELIGIOUS GATHERINGS - Permitted to open to maximum capacity of 150 persons, masks must be worn at all times and proper physical distancing must be maintained. Drive-in services continue to be permitted.



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
